Important Class Information:

Equitation Classes: Exhibitors to enter the ring as a group. Exhibitors to be judged at the walk, trot (sitting and posting), and canter, both ways of the ring. The judge may request additional patterns to be ridden.

Exhibitors will be judged on their position, seat, and effective use of aids. The judge may ask for any movement from the USEF Training or First level tests. Dressage dress and saddlery are required.

13 & Under: Exhibitors eligible until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 13.

14-18: Exhibitors eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches 14 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 18.

Horses may enter two consecutive levels only- even if more than one rider.
Horses are limited to three tests per day (Intro - Fourth Level) & two per day FEI.

Conditions of Entry ~

- Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- Checks returned by the bank will be assessed \$25 upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.
- In the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, wild land fire, accident or other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any similar fees for the cancelled class or classes.
- Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages.
- Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.
- Owner/Exhibitor/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the show grounds, will be subject to the rules of the Horse Show management. However, Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any horse entered or on the grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Sierra Nevada Chapter of the California Dressage Society, any additional recognizing organizations, Pair of Aces Stables, the horse show and its management and contractors, officers, directors, employees, agents and volunteers for any loss or accident to his/her horse, horses or equipment which may occur.
- All Owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed are due and payable during the show. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.
- Competitors are responsible for all **INSURANCE** for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc.

Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.

- Current USEF, FEI, and USDF tests will be used.

Entries~ Scheduling"" Ride Times

- Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership proofs, signatures and payment. Numbers will not be released until this process is complete; entries without payment in full will be returned.
- **Withdrawing at any time will not excuse the responsible party from paying all class, office, and other fees.**
- Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judge, riders and management.
- Rider scheduling preferences, if noted on the entry, will be indulged when possible.
- Requests for shorter breaks will be accommodated when logistically possible.
- Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty.

Show Grounds ~

- **Show Office Telephone Number** during the show: Contact Beth Coffey Curle 775-240-9080
- **All parking for the show is in the paddock accessed by the open gate on Holcomb Ranch Lane. To conserve space, please park cars should park along the south fence line. Trailers should park side by side.**
- **Restrooms:** Restrooms are available outside the main barn.
- **Food** will not be available for sale on the premises.
- Trash must be placed in the facility's dumpsters.
- **DOGS** must be on leash at all times and owners must be able to provide proof of current rabies vaccination. There is a fine of \$100 per occurrence and owner may be refused entry into future shows.
- All classes are planned to be held in a large (20mx60m) arena. Footing is synthetic materials, sand/composition in all competition and warm-up arenas.
- The assigned bridle number must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall or trailer.
- Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show and, at the discretion of Show Management, will be further restricted to those warming up for the class(es) in progress when there is congestion. **NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE WARM-UP AREAS AT ANY TIME.**
- All lunging must take place in the designated lunging area. No lunging in the warm up arena.
- **Non-Competing Horses.** Each non-competing horse must have a signed release, wear an assigned number, must observe the rules governing the use of the warm-up areas and must pay any required fees, including stabling, haul-in and grounds fees.

Stabling~

- Stabling reservations and payment must be made directly to the Pair of Aces Stables. Call 775-220-2270 to make stabling reservations.

Juniors

- All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend and hold Show Management, its employees and volunteers, the facility at which the show is held, Sierra Nevada Chapter of CDS, and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.
- Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind.
